## ***DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE RAPIDLY APPROACHING***

Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez announced that the cut-off to register to vote in the August 26, 2014 Primary Election is rapidly approaching. The cut-off is midnight, **MONDAY, JULY 28, 2014**.

A new voter registration form must be completed by anyone who has moved (even to a new apartment number in the same complex), changed their name since their last registration, is a new Pima County resident, or would like to change their party affiliation.

There are a number of ways that people can complete their voter registration:

- The easiest way is to go to [servicearizona.com](http://servicearizona.com) and complete the registration online. Voters can access this site directly or through the Recorder's website at [www.recorder.pima.gov](http://www.recorder.pima.gov) at the link for "EZVoter". You must have your current address with MVD before using this option.
- Forms are available at multiple locations throughout the county: any Pima County Recorder's office, any Arizona Department of Motor Vehicle branch, all post offices and libraries, political party headquarters, and city/town halls.
