DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE RAPIDLY APPROACHING

Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez announced that the cut-off to register to vote for the November 7th Consolidated Election is rapidly approaching. The cut-off is midnight, **TUESDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2017**. The following jurisdictions are conducting all ballot by mail elections. All registered voters in these districts will receive a ballot by mail.

- City of Tucson
- Tucson Unified School District
- Sunnyside Unified School District
- Flowing Wells Unified School District
- Marana Unified School District
- Drexel Heights Fire District
- Avra Valley Fire District
- Picture Rocks Fire District

The Town of Oro Valley is holding a polling place election on November 7, 2017. All voters on the Permanent Early Voting List in the Town of Oro Valley will receive a ballot in the mail. Any other voter in the town of Oro Valley can request a vote by mail ballot by going to the Recorder's website at: <https://www.recorder.pima.gov/EarlyBallotRequest> or you can call our office at 520-724-4330.

A new voter registration form must be completed by anyone who has moved (even to a new apartment number in the same complex), changed their name since their last registration, is a new Pima County resident, or would like to change their party affiliation.

There are a number of ways that people can complete their voter registration:

- The easiest way is to go to servicearizona.com and complete the registration online. Voters can access this site directly or through the Recorder's website at recorder.pima.gov at the link for "EZVoter". You must have your current address with MVD before using this option.
- Forms are available at multiple locations throughout the county: any Pima County Recorder's office, all post offices, public libraries, political party headquarters and city/town halls.
- Voters can download a form directly from the Recorder's website, complete it and mail it in.

Check Your Registration Online

Voters are able check their voter registration status on the Pima County Recorder's Office website: recorder.pima.gov click on the "[Check your Registration](#)" tab. In order to check your registration you must have either your Arizona State Driver's license number or voter registration I.D. number. Information available includes your registration name and address, early ballot status, party affiliation, election district assignments and voting history.
