## Recorder's Office Open Late for Voter Registration on Monday, Oct. 5

The Recorder's office will be open until 10:00 p.m. on Monday, October 5, the last day to register to vote in the 2020 General Election. Both the downtown office at 240 N. Stone Ave., and the eastside office at 6920 E Broadway Blvd, Suite D, will be open until 10:00 p.m.

"We offer extended hours on the voter registration deadline day," says Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez. "Voters may come to our office and complete paper forms. Now is the time to register; do not risk missing the cutoff date."

If you wish to vote on all state and local issues, you must present evidence of citizenship using an Arizona driver's license, birth certificate, or U.S. Passport. Digital or paper copies of the birth certificate or passport are also acceptable. If you do not present evidence of citizenship, you will only be permitted to vote for candidates for federal offices.

"If you have moved since the last election, you must register to vote at your new address," she continues. "By law, the post office will not forward your ballot by mail to your new address."

Voters should always remember to update their voter registration if they move to a new address.
