- Independent Voters must request which partisan ballot they'd like to receive. They can request a ballot by mail or in person at an <u>Early Voting site</u> or <u>Vote Center</u> on Election Day!
- Any voter can request a one-time Early Ballot. Call the Recorder's Office at 520-724-4330 or use our online Ballot By Mail request form by July 22.
- Any voter can vote early in person at any <u>Early Voting site</u>.
- We have several <u>resources</u> to assist voters with disabilities, mobility concerns or language barriers. Call 520-724-4330 for assistance.
- Did you tear your ballot? Are you missing an envelope? Visit one of our <u>Early Voting sites</u> for a replacement or give us a call to hear additional options.
- The most common identification used during in-person voting is a State ID such as a driver's license. However, there are many <u>Acceptable Forms of Identification for Voting</u>.
- Ballots must be received by the Pima County Recorder's office by 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, August 2, 2022. Ballots received after 7 p.m. won't be counted.
