TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN THE
NOVEMBER 2, 2010 GENERAL ELECTION

Pima County Recorder, F. Ann Rodriguez would like to remind citizens that time is quickly running out to register to vote for the **November 2, 2010 General Election**. The cut-off to register to vote in the General Election is midnight, **MONDAY, OCTOBER 4, 2010**. Ms. Rodriguez states, "Do not wait until the last minute to request your ballot. You want to make sure you receive all of your voting materials in time."

WHO SHOULD COMPLETE A NEW VOTER REGISTRATION FORM?

- ✚ Eligible residents who have never registered to vote in Pima County before, including new County residents
- ✚ Voters residing in Pima County who will attain the age of 18 by November 2, 2010 and are not registered elsewhere
- ✚ Voters who have moved *including to a new apartment in same complex*
- ✚ Voters who have changed their name since their last registration
- ✚ Voters who would like to change their party affiliation

Early Voting Begins October 7th

Those voters who are on the Permanent Early Voter List, as well as those voters who have contacted the Recorder's Office and requested an early ballot, will be mailed their vote-by-mail ballots beginning on October 7, 2010. The final day to request an early ballot by mail for the November 2, 2008 General Election is **FRIDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2010.**

Early Voting Sites throughout Pima County will be open beginning October 7th and are available for **every** registered voter in Pima County prior Election Day. Please visit the Pima County Recorder's website (www.recorder.pima.gov) for specific locations and times for each site. "We want to encourage *every eligible voter* to cast a ballot and make their voice heard," Ms. Rodriguez states, "Our system of democracy is only strengthened by the active participation of its citizens in exercising their right to vote."
