Early voting for the November 2, 2010 General Election has started and Ms. Rodriguez, the Pima County Recorder, wants to encourage everyone to use the voting resources available to them.

“Early voting has become an extremely popular way to vote in elections,” stated Ms. Rodriguez. “As of this date, we will be mailing more than 231,000 vote-by-mail ballots. This surpasses total numbers of vote-by-mail ballots mailed in the 2008 Presidential Election.”

Voting early is easy and convenient with two different methods for early voting:

- The first method is to order a ballot to be mailed to your home. The ballot can be voted thoughtfully and leisurely in the comfort and privacy of your home. When the ballot is voted, it is simply put in the white ballot affidavit envelope, which must be signed by the voter, placed in the yellow postage-paid return envelope and mailed back to the Pima County Recorder’s office.

Voters who are on the Permanent Early Voting List will automatically receive a ballot in the mail, and **do not need to request one.**

- Any registered Pima County voter is invited to visit any one of the satellite early voting sites throughout Pima County to cast their ballot early. A list of sites and hours is available on the Pima County Recorder’s website (www.recorder.pima.gov)

“We have placed these sites around Pima County so that, no matter where you live, there is a convenient walk-in early voting site somewhere,” said Ms. Rodriguez. “For this important election, we are even opening our sites on some Saturdays to accommodate voters who can’t get to an early voting site during the work week.”
