Voting as a College Student

Where do I register? How do I vote?

As a college student, you may be away from "home" temporarily or permanently. But you can only register to vote in one place, so ask yourself which location you consider home.

Please keep in mind that your tuition, grants or scholarships may be affected by residency, so before deciding to register in a new location, contact your college's financial aid office.

DO NOT have someone fill out your ballot for you, because you must sign your own Ballot Affidavit Envelope. Official Election Mail, including ballots, cannot be forwarded. Instead, request that your county Registrar send your ballot directly to your current mailing address.

I'm registered in Pima County but living away. How do I get my Pima County ballot?

- Arizona voters, with an Arizona mailing address, can join the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) to be automatically sent an Early Ballot for every election for which they are eligible.
- Voters temporarily away from Arizona can have a ballot mailed to them by submitting a one-time request.
- You can register at your college address if you want to vote on issues in your new community, but you'll no longer be registered to vote in Pima County.
- If you choose to register in your new home, please cancel your Pima County registration.

I'm registered outside of Arizona and going to college in Pima County. How do I get my ballot from home?

Every state handles its mailed (absentee) ballots differently.

- Contact the Registrar in your home county to learn how to receive your ballot at your temporary address in Pima County.
- If you do not request a mailed ballot in time, you will have to return home to vote at a voting location by Election Day.

I am a citizen and have an Arizona Driver's License or non-operating Identification Card! How do I register?

Great! You can register online using AZMVDnow.gov or fill out a paper form and provide the identification number in the appropriate box.

Your Arizona-issued license or AZ ID Card also will satisfy your Proof of Residency!

Do I need an Arizona Driver's License to register to vote?


No, a license is not required, but it's helpful. Let's see which form is best for you to use: State or Federal?

Arizona requires Proof of Citizenship and Proof of Residency to vote in local and state races, called a Full Ballot. If you can't provide Proof of Citizenship with your State application, your registration will be rejected per a recent US Supreme Court ruling.

If you are unable to provide this documentation when registering, you may fill out a **Federal Voter Registration form** to vote a Federal-Only Ballot. This will allow you to vote for the Presidential, Senate, and Congressional races in a federal election until you can provide the required documentation. **Note:** By signing, you are still affirming to be a U.S. citizen.

How do I qualify for a full ballot if I don't have an Arizona-issued Driver's License or Identification Card, but I do have other documents proving my citizenship?

- We recommend filling out a paper **Arizona Voter Registration form**. You must include your proof WITH your form. You can print one from our website, or find locations that keep them on hand.
- You can email images of your Proof of Residency and Citizenship to voter@recorder.pima.gov.
- We do not recommend that you give this documentation to anyone who has not identified themselves as a Registrar from our office or the Secretary of State.
