

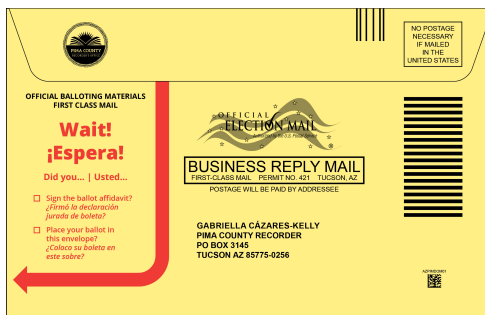
Pima County's One Envelope Solution

The Pima County Recorder's Office is improving the Ballot by Mail process, moving to a one-envelope solution to increase efficiency and expedite election results.

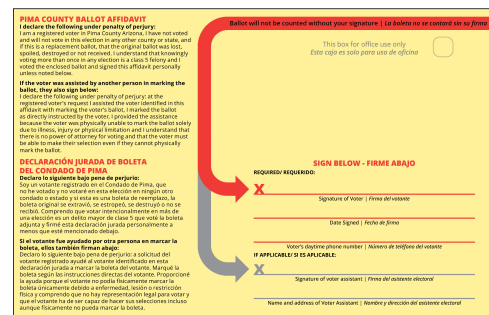
Beginning with the Congressional District 7 election cycle, Ballot by Mail voters will receive a single envelope that combines the Ballot Affidavit and return envelopes. This will replace the previous two-envelope system.

Key Benefits of the Single-Envelope System:

- Speeds up ballot processing, leading to faster early ballot reporting
- Simplifies the voting process by eliminating confusion over multiple envelopes
- Reduces "naked" ballots, which are ballots returned without required affidavits
- Lowers the costs by printing and mailing fewer envelopes
- Decreases paper waste, making the process more environmentally friendly
- Maintains privacy and security by assuring that no affiliation is visible on the envelope, as ballots travel securely from one government agency to another
