ONLY 3 DAYS LEFT TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN AUGUST PRIMARY

Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez announced that the cut-off to register to vote in the August 26, 2014 Primary Election is rapidly approaching. The cut-off is midnight, **MONDAY, JULY 28, 2014**.

A new voter registration form must be completed by anyone who has moved (even to a new apartment number in the same complex), changed their name since their last registration, is a new Pima County resident, or would like to change their party affiliation.

Please remember that, if you are registering to vote for the first time in Pima County, you must bring proof of United States citizenship. An Arizona driver's license issued after 10/01/1996, your birth certificate, U.S. Passport or a naturalization certificate may be used to establish citizenship.

In order to support voters who wish to register to vote, the Recorder's main office, located at 115 N. Church Ave., in Tucson will be open extended hours on Monday, July 28, 2014. Hours for that day ONLY will be 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. Voters are encouraged to stop in and turn in their registration forms. In addition, staff will be manning the phones until 10:00 p.m. as well, so voters can call with any questions they may have.

There are a number of ways that people can complete their voter registration:

- The easiest way is to go to <u>servicearizona.com</u> and complete the registration online. Voters can access this site directly or through the Recorder's website at <u>www.recorder.pima.gov</u> at the link for "EZVoter". You must have your current address on file with MVD before using this option.
- Forms are available at multiple locations throughout the county: any Pima County Recorder's office, any Arizona Department of Motor Vehicle branch, all post offices and libraries, political party headquarters, and city/town halls.
- ➤ Voters can download a form directly from the Recorder's website, complete it and mail it in.

Although you cannot make changes to your voter registration over the phone, our staff is always available to answer any questions voters may have.
