ONLY 5 DAYS LEFT TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN THE AUGUST PRIMARY ELECTION

Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez announced that the deadline to register to vote in the August 30, 2016 Primary Election is rapidly approaching. The cutoff is midnight, **MONDAY, AUGUST 1, 2016.**

A new voter registration form must be completed by anyone who has moved (even to a new apartment number in the same complex), changed their name since their last registration, is a new Pima County resident, or would like to change their party affiliation.

Please remember that, if you are registering to vote for the first time in Pima County, you must provide proof of United States citizenship. An Arizona driver's license issued after 10/01/1996, your birth certificate, U.S. Passport or a naturalization certificate may be used to establish citizenship.

There are a number of ways that people can complete their voter registration:

The easiest way is to go to <u>servicearizona.com</u> and complete the registration online. Voters can access this site directly or through the Recorder's website at <u>www.recorder.pima.gov</u> at the link for "EZVoter". - Forms are available at multiple locations throughout the county: any Pima County Recorder's office, any Arizona Department of Motor Vehicle branch, all United States Post Offices and libraries, political party headquarters, and city/town halls.
- Voters can download a <u>Voter Registration form</u> directly from the Pima County Recorder's website, complete it and mail the form back to the address listed on the form.

Voters can check their voter registration status on the Pima County Recorder's Office website: <u>www.recorder.pima.gov</u> click on the "<u>Check your Registration</u>" tab. In order to check your registration you must have either your Arizona State Driver's license number or voter registration number. Information available includes your registration name and address, early ballot status, party affiliation, election district assignments and voting history.

For more information, voters may call the Pima County Recorder's office at 724-4330. Although you cannot make changes to your voter registration over the phone, our staff is always available to answer any questions voters may have.
