Early Voting hours extended in Pima County

The Pima County Recorder's Office has extended Early Voting hours for the March 19 Presidential Preference Election.

The Recorder's Office has 9 Early Voting Locations. On the last day of Early Voting, Friday, March 15, three locations will be open till 7 p.m.

- Recorder's Downtown Office, 240 N Stone Ave.
- Recorder's Country Club Office, 6550 S Country Club Rd.
- Fellowship Bible Church, 6700 E Broadway Blvd.

These extended hours are also available for those dropping off ballots.

These hours were modified because of new laws passed by the Arizona Legislature after your ballot packets were mailed.

To make sure you have the most up-to-date information on times, dates and locations, be sure to check recorder.pima.gov.

Emergency Voting hours are 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on both Saturday, March 16, and Monday, March 18, at nine Emergency Voting sites. This service is for any registered voter who has an emergency and wants to vote in person but can't make it to a Vote Center on Election Day. We will not ask about the nature of a voter's emergency. Please note that times have changed, and these are the most up-to-date times.

We are committed to making it as easy as possible for voters to vote early. For future elections, we are making every effort to set consistent hours to make the voting experience more accessible to the public. Another change in state law is the new date for the Primary Election: July 30.

We'll send out more detailed information about the timeline for the Primary Election as it gets closer.
