Emergency Voting available for July 30 Primary

In-person Emergency Voting is available for all eligible voters for the 2024 Primary Election.

Scheduled for Saturday, July 27, and Monday, July 29, Emergency Voting is available for anyone who didn't cast their ballot during the regular Early Voting period and is unable to vote in person on Election Day.

All registered voters in Pima County are eligible to participate in Emergency Voting. They must present [valid identification](#) before voting and sign a short affidavit affirming that an emergency prevented them from voting. We will not ask about the nature of the emergency and welcome all voters.

Before Emergency Voting, all locations, except our East Side office, will be open with extended hours until 7 pm on the final day of Early Voting, Friday, July 26.

- **Saturday, July 27:** All sites will be open 9 am – 3 pm.
- **Monday, July 29:** Our Downtown and Country Club offices will be open 8 am - 5 pm. All other locations will be open 9 am - 3 pm.
